JobsPlus is a new employer incentive which encourages and rewards employers who offer employment opportunities to the long term unemployed. This incentive is designed to encourage employers and businesses to focus their recruitment efforts on those who have been out of work for long periods. Any jobseeker that has been in receipt of a jobseeker's payment from the Department of Social Protection for 12 months or more will be considered eligible to be recruited under this incentive. Therefore, a jobseeker that is currently in receipt of a jobseeker's payment (jobseeker's assistance or jobseeker's benefit) can be recruited, but they must have been in receipt of this payment for at least 12 months immediately prior to starting work (periods on jobseeker's assistance and jobseeker's benefit can be combined). If a jobseeker was engaged on community employment, Tús or the rural social scheme (and some other schemes) and is now unemployed, they may also be eligible. Literacy Support and TTRS (Touch Type Read and Spell) for Primary School Children

Is your child experiencing difficulty with reading, spelling or writing? Has your child been diagnosed with a learning difficulty and are you concerned about their progress? Do you need advice on how to support you child?

IRD Duhallow is running **weekly literacy classes** in James O'Keeffe Institute, Newmarket to support primary aged children in the area. The classes are run by an experienced Primary teacher who has specialised in teaching children with learning difficulties and the classes aim to support the students' literacy needs, taking account of their strengths and weaknesses. The service also provides regular advisory clinics for parents/guardians to discuss the students' progress in class, offer advice on how to support the child at home or to discuss any other educational queries/concerns. Classes are open to children aged between Senior Infants and 6th Class.

TTRS (Touch Type Read and Spell) is a specially devised computer programme for children with learning difficulties. The programme has two functions. Firstly, it teaches children to touch type - a vital skill for all ages. In addition, the words used for typing are some of the most commonly misspelt words so children, unknown to themselves, are learning how to spell.
