IRD Duhallow receives two Environment Awards

Cork Environmental Forum presented its **Community Development Group award** to Michael Twohig, Michael Doyle and Fran Igoe of IRD Duhallow LIFE Project at its recent awards ceremony in recognition of the work of its project to protect the otter, hen harrier and freshwater pearl mussel and its effort to eradicate an invasive plant, Himalayan Balsam from the banks of the River Allow.

The Himalayan Balsam plant was introduced here from India in 1839, as an ornamental plant with pretty purple or light pink, flower and has since spread to most parts of Ireland. It leads to erosion of river backs, competes with native vegetation and also impacts on pearl mussel and salmon spawning due to excess silt being washed down rivers in winter flood. The species prolific in damp soil area, such as along river banks where it forms continuous stands, It can also take root in damp woodland and swampy areas. It is one of the highest risk non-invasive plants here, largely due to its impact on native waterside vegetation and damp ground at the expense of native species. The plant can kill up to two-thirds of native plants, but is possible to successfully control or eradicate it from infested sites.

This award is in recognition of the work to date carried out by IRD Duhallow under the LIFE Programme with the co-operation of the EU, Inland Fisheries Ireland, the landowners, RSS, Tús, Kanturk Angling Group, supporters and volunteers.

Cork Environmental Forum also presented IRD Duhallow Community Garden with an award on the night for its work which includes the Grow It Yourself Group, Towards Occupation Group, COPE and Newmarket Afterschools with the assistance of Tús and RSS Participants under the leadership of Rachel Budd.

Organic Produce from the Garden has been on sale at Duhallow Community Food Services and has got great support from the public.

EPA Research Project in bottom up approach to River Water Management

John Ballinger has taken up the post to lead this exciting project which aims to identify ways for better community involvement in water management. John previously worked on Integrated Catchment Management projects in his native New Zealand. Currently the project is interviewing practitioners in the field both in Ireland and Internationally and is also drawing from lessons learnt through the River Allow Catchment Management Initiative. Native Woodland Scheme is now open

This scheme is targeted especially at woodlands designated as Special Areas of Conservation (SAC) and to protect and enhance water quality through the creation of new native woodlands adjacent rivers and streams. This is particularly relevant in catchments designated for freshwater pearl mussels, salmon and otters. The scheme also targets community-led native woodland projects through a link with the NeighbourWood scheme which provides for pathways and signage.
