Monitoring completed on important Hen Harrier roost

Survey work led by local bird expert, Dr Brin McDonnell, is now drawing to a close on what is possibly Ireland's most significant winter roost for Hen Harrier. Since November 2015, IRD Duhallow's RaptorLIFE team together with a group of volunteers have been surveying the winter roost, which is located outside of the Special Area of Protection.

Surveys have been conducted at dusk, just as the birds return from their feeding forays to their roosts, to shelter from the severe winter weather. To ensure an accurate bird count, the winter roost was monitored at any one time by 4 pairs of surveyors stationed at 4 different locations. Both male and female Hen Harriers were counted, with up to 14 confirmed birds recorded and more on other occasions. When the weather was most severe, the birds would fly in and quickly drop down into the scrub to roost. When weather conditions were calmer, the birds would take their time to settle and fly around for longer. A dawn survey was carried out under the guidance of Dr Alan Mee and Tony Nagle of the Irish Raptor Study Group. Once the birds had dispersed, a search of the roost area was conducted to gather Hen Harrier pellets. When analysed, these pellets will reveal what the birds were feeding on.

The monitoring data is currently being collated and will be forwarded to the site owner, who is in regular contact with IRD Duhallow with regard to management options in the roost area. A preliminary report was forwarded to NPWS, and we look forward to working with the Government Agency on the management of Hen harrier in Duhallow. At a recent meeting it was agreed that NPWS and IRD Duhallow would collaborate again on a Hen harrier satellite tracking programme. The aim is to share resources and information so that the best outcomes for Hen harrier can be achieved in terms of learning about their behaviour, especially in winter. Naturally this information should lead to better management of the birds, by informing locally led Agri-environment schemes and other conservation management initiatives.

We would like to thank all of our volunteers and staff who braved the elements, and the Irish Raptor Study Group for their technical input. Special praise is reserved for Dr Brin McDonnell of the Duhallow Birdwatch Group, due to his ongoing dedication and support for the project.
