IRD Duhallow's Raptor LIFE Project Supported by the LIFE Financial Instrument of the European Community



It has been a very busy season for RaptorLIFE with both our ongoing removal of Himalayan balsam, and treating vast amounts of knotweed. September to early October is the optimal period for dealing with knotweed. RaptorLIFE covered over 25km of infested riverbank (Araglin and upper Blackwater) by injecting herbicide directly into the plants. We also sprayed knotweed on over 100km of roadways within the Duhallow region and the Mullaghereiks Special Protected Area. This is labour intensive work that will have to be repeated for the next 2-3 years. However, controlling invasive species like knotweed before they get out of hand will help protect our wildlife, rivers and important infrastructure.

A big thank you to Rosie Campbell and Denis McCarthy of Ballyhoura Falconry for hosting the "Revealing our Raptors" day at IRD Duhallow. Over 47 people enjoyed an up close and personal experience with Ireland's birds of prey and left with an increased knowledge of these unique birds. We hope to hear about many more raptor sightings in the near future!

RaptorLIFE have also been busy trapping small mammals in a variety of habitats within Duhallow. Why the interest in small mammals, and in this case rodents specifically? Because they are hard to see or find due to their ability to camouflage, being active at night and relative shyness, many do not appreciate the services they provide. Around the world, small mammals act as pollinators, seed dispersers, and control insects. They also support forest regeneration and maintain forest health, aerate the soil and help increase plant diversity. And...they also make great food for raptors!
