

IRD Duhallow's Raptor LIFE Project Supported by the LIFE Financial Instrument of the European Community



IRD Duhallow RaptorLIFE project commenced in 2015 with the aim to connect and restore two Natura 2000 sites for the conservation of upland and freshwater biodiversity, including hen harrier, merlin, Atlantic salmon and brook lamprey. As we enter the final months of the project it is timely to reflect on some achievements to date.

Enhancement of habitats for hen harrier and merlin: Across six project farms vegetation management has been undertaken on 48ha of farmland. By flailing or mulching areas dominated by rushes, purple moor grass or rank heather, farmland biodiversity has been enhanced, allowing a variety of plant species to re-colonize and improving the quality of habitat for hen harrier prey species. A large area which had been left bare by forestry clear felling has also been reseeded with heather seed harvested locally. 23ha of Rhododendron and self-seeding conifers have also been eradicated from where they encroached on hen harrier habitats. One of the largest undertakings was the creation of a foraging corridor which connects the Blackwater SAC to the Stacks to Mullaghareirks SPA in a landscape dominated by intensive forestry. With the help of Coillte, this 3km corridor is nearing completion, with almost 14ha of mature conifers removed and replaced with native trees, heather seeds or left to revegetate naturally. All summer, RaptorLIFE has monitored hen harrier nest sites, many of which have already fledged successfully. This season has been the best season since 2015 for hen harrier occupancy and breeding success.

Restoration of river habitats: By improving water quality and reducing the sediment input into the Blackwater & Owentaraglin rivers the project aims to improve habitat quality for salmon, lamprey and freshwater pearl mussel. These species require clean, silt free gravels and waters free of excessive nutrients in order to reproduce, survive and complete their life cycle. To achieve these conditions, the project has undertaken the restoration of riparian vegetation to prevent erosion of the river banks and provide a buffer to nutrients entering from farm land. RaptorLIFE has fenced 29ha of river bank, excluding livestock from sensitive water courses, reducing pollution from poaching and manure, and allowing native vegetation to recover in areas that were previously overgrazed. Areas subject to excessive erosion have been stabilised by planting willow and other native trees. RaptorLIFE monitors freshwater invertebrates such as stonefly as indicators water quality; Results show that water quality on these rivers remains stable at good to moderate status. RaptorLIFE also monitor fish populations with the help of IFI. Following a significant fish kill which took place in 2016 a recovery in salmon and trout populations has been detected in 2018. A final assessment of water quality and fish stocks will be undertaken in August / September 2019.

Invasive species eradication: August is peak invasive species management season and our crews have taken to the rivers and roads of Duhallow to continue the eradication process. Himalayan balsam is being controlled by hand on over 80km of river with significant progress to date. We are treating Japanese knotweed on over 400km of roads and 25km of river. Those stands that have been treated for three seasons are already exhibiting a 66% decline in area with further decline expected this season.

Farming for Nature Awards - IRD Duhallow RaptorLIFE would like to congratulate one of our project farmers, Connie O'Connor on his nomination for the "Farming for Nature" Awards. Connie and his wife Julia, were among 39 farming families nationally that were nominated for their excellent work in supporting nature on their farm and in their community. Connie and Julia farm 47 hectares near the source of the River Blackwater. As a RaptorLIFE project farmer, Connie has been enthusiastic about taking on the many measures to enhance and restore farmland habitats for the conservation of hen harrier and other freshwater and terrestrial species. Connie farms suckler cattle in a non-intensive approach. His farm varies from open rich blanket bog to rough grassland and some improved grassland. He uses minimal fertiliser and low stocking density to maintain his species rich grasslands, he uses mulching instead of chemicals to control rushes, he manages the structural variation in the grasslands to support raptor prey species & he has taken action to protect watercourses from livestock & erosion. The judging panel were very impressed with Connie & his enthusiasm for the protection of wildlife & the environment.

Joseph Sexton R.I.P. On the 24th of June, IRD Duhallow were deeply saddened to learn of the death of Joseph Sexton, a member of the RSS crew that worked on RaptorLIFE. Joseph had worked at IRD Duhallow for over 10 years, and all have fond memories of him as a character of joviality and fun. Joseph was a very diligent worker and took great pride in every job he set his hands to. A farmer in his own right, he had a good understanding of the land and recognised the value of his work toward improving the wider environment for all. Whether it be invasive species management, river bank protection, hedge laying or tree planting, Joseph completed every task to a high standard and motivated others to do the same. The wealth of local knowledge Joseph had built over the course of both SAMOK and RaptorLIFE was invaluable. He was chatty, witty and a great man for the weekly round-up of sporting fixtures and local news. Joseph will be sadly missed by all at IRD Duhallow and our deepest sympathies are extended to his family and friends.
